**SHRUBS & TREES in #3 containers** (10" diameter x 11" deep) are so noted in the "Size" column. All other SHRUBS & TREES come in either #1 (6" diameter x 7" deep) or #2 (8" diameter x 9" deep) containers. PERENNIALS are priced individually and come in one quart or #1 containers.

Some plants listed may be unavailable due to losses during the growing season; also, quantities may be limited for some species. Plants will be available on a first come, first served basis. (If your order cannot be filled, a full refund will be made.)

All native plants are genetically adapted for our area and provide food in the form of nuts, seeds, berries, fruits, leaves, pollen, and nectar that best meet the needs of butterflies and other pollinators, as well as hummingbirds and other birds and wildlife.

#### (A) TREES

**Native trees are the keystone species in any functioning backyard ecosystem.** When we think of planting a tree, however, we tend to think of "specimen" trees — a single tree surrounded by lawn. You can maximize environmental impact by planting groupings of trees with an understory of smaller trees and shrubs in tree/shrub islands, on edges, or along property borders.

**(C) PERENNIALS**

**Perennial flowers and groundcovers provide pollen, nectar, or leaf food for butterflies, moths, other native insects, birds, and other wildlife.** Several listed below are also essential butterfly host plants. Plant perennials in groups of three (3) or more to maximize environmental value.

**Woodland Garden Gems:** These plants are all perfect candidates for shade or part-shade locations in shrub/tree borders. These gorgeous bloomers will provide important nectar and pollen for pollinators while naturalizing by spreading or self-seeding, and so increasing your native wildflower understory with each coming year.
